

## Broken Rib

see our *Noro Silk Garden* model

Cast on any number of stitches that is a **multiple of 4 st +1 st** (*this is important*).

The number you cast on will vary according to: the thickness of your yarn, the needle size you use and the desired width of your scarf. We recommend using a needle size 1 or 2 larger than is called for on the yarn label to add drape to the scarf fabric.

Row 1            \*P1, k3; rep from \* to last st, p1.

Row 2            K2, \*p1, k3; rep from \* to last 3 sts, p1, k2.

Repeat pattern until scarf measures desired length. Cast off. Fringe if desired.



## Purl Lace

see our *Burly Spun Bison* scarf

Cast on 16 sts on a US size 15 for a 6-inch wide scarf. You can also make a shawl or stole with this pattern using any even number of stitches. We recommend using a needle size 1 or 2 larger than is called for on the yarn label to add extra drape to the scarf fabric.

Row 1 (RS)    K1, \*YO, P2tog, rep from \* to last st, K1.

Row 2            Repeat row 1

Continue in pattern until scarf measures desired length. Cast off. Fringe if desired.



## Basic Lace

see our *Cascade Magnum Scarf*

Cast on even number of stitches. (*Our Magnum scarf used 10 stitches on size 35 needles.*)

K1, \*yfwd, S1 K1, PSSO\*, K1

Repeat this pattern until desired length. Cast off. Fringe if desired.

## Legend

K = Knit,

P = Purl,

PSSO = Pass Slipped Stitch Over

RS = right side

S = Slip

Tog = together

Yfwd = bring yarn forward (between the needles)

YO = yarn over

\* = instructions within asterisks are to be repeated

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
